Dear Friends.

We just got back from looking for the New Moon, and at the time of this writing, we are not aware of any positive naked eye sightings from this evening's observation on 22 March 2023.

If no positive reports come in from this evening's observation, we will go out again tomorrow evening to look for the New Moon and let you know whether we saw it. <u>Subscribe</u> to our email list and social media platforms, so you don't miss that report.

The photo at the top of this report from was taken from our observation point in Jerusalem this evening, however as we didn't see the moon, you will not find the moon in not in the photo.

On behalf of all of us who keep the Biblical Calendar, we wish to thank everyone who looked for the new moon from Israel this evening, and all of you who are supporting this important effort from afar.

How do we know a month can't be more than 30 days?

From our perspective here on Earth, it takes the Moon 29.5 days to revolve around the Earth. That means the New Moon will either be visible at the end of the 29th day, or 30th day of the month (baring atmospheric obstructions). It seems that even in Biblical Times they knew that a month can't be more than 30 days, as David said to Yehonatan, "tomorrow is the new moon" (1 Samuel 20:5). How did David know the following day was the New Moon? Presumably, the New Moon wasn't sighted at the end of the 29th day, and so he knew the next day would be the beginning of the month by default.

How do we know the New Moon must be sighted from Israel?

The Biblical Calendar is based on the development of the barley crop, and the New Moon being sighted, in Israel (Dt 6:1). In fact, the Biblical Calendar doesn't work properly if one tries to establish it based on signs outside of the Land (Gen 1:14). For example, if someone in Australia were to begin the year based on the local barley crop, they would end up starting the year six months after they are supposed to. Likewise, if the stats were too low for the New Moon to be sighted in Israel, but someone decided to start the month based on the moon being sighted in another country, that would lead them to keep the holidays on the wrong day. Even if it's believed that the New Moon wasn't sighted from Israel due to atmospheric obstructions (aka "Acts of God"), we can't assume that the atmospheric obstructions were a mistake. Rather it's believed that we are supposed to look for the New Moon from Israel, and trust that if we are meant to see the New Moon, it will be revealed to us.

As to when to begin this upcoming year, I personally am giving a lot of thought to Lev 23:9-14 (as well as Ex 23:14-19 and Dt 16:16-17), and considering whether everyone is expected to bring an omer of their barley harvest on Yom HaNafat HaOmer (The Day of the Wave Sheaf Offering), and whether we may need harvestable barley fields throughout the Land.
