This month shall be the beginning of months for you; it is to be the first month of the year to you. (Exodus 12:2)



Dear Friends,

We want to thank you for partnering with us to restore the Biblical Calendar, and to take this opportunity to try and respond to some of your questions regarding the types of barley fields we find on our Barley Inspections.

## **Volunteer Barley Fields**

These are abandoned plots of land that have wild barley growing on them. The barley in these fields are under a lot of stress due to the soil not being tilled, the seeds not being spaced out, and the crop not being rotated. Because these fields aren't tilled, the soil can't properly absorb the heavy rainfall, which in turn often drowns the barley. Tilling is also important in preventing weeds, and so these fields often become infested with oats, flowers, and other vegetation, with whom they must fight for resources. Similarly, because the seeds haven't been spaced out, they end up reproducing on top of each other and suffocating one another. And because the crop isn't rotated, it lacks the nutrients it needs to thrive. Because of all these stressors, the barley ripens prematurely in an effort to produce seed before it dies. This is why the seeds are sometimes very thin and dry out before they've finished

developing. Also, the stalks and heads are very frail causing them to shatter easily. Volunteer barley fields are not harvested.

## **Highly Cultivated Barley Fields**

These are planted fields with a strain of barley that ripens very quickly. We've even seen the seeds become Aviv when the head is just starting to emerge from its sheaf. It's important to note that these fields are often combined. Combines are a very efficient piece of machinery, that reaps (cuts the stalks), threshes (separates the grain from the stalks and husk), and winnows (removes the chaff), all in one process. The problem, is that the farmer usually desiccates the field (accelerates the drying process using chemicals) before combining, as the crop needs to be quite dry, and they're often not interested in waiting for this to happen naturally. I've also noticed that when I walk out of these fields, I have an immediate rash on the inside of my arm, which I suspect is a reaction to some sort of pesticide/herbicide they're using.

#### **More Natural Barley Fields**

These are planted fields, which use a strain that looks similar to the wild barley we see. These fields are swathed (cut and left on the ground to dry) when they become Aviv, as the Ancient Israelites would have done. And I don't get a rash when I go through them. We feel these are the best fields to use when determining the beginning of the year.

#### **Concluding Thoughts**

We are commanded to begin the Biblical Year with Chodesh HaAviv (Month of the Aviv) (Ex12:2, Ex 13:3-4, Ex 23:15, Ex 34:18, Dt 16:1). This ensures the Biblical Calendar stays in sync with the solar cycle, and the 7th month begins at the right time. Every year, we carry out thorough Barley Inspections to know when to begin the Biblical Year. On 7 April 2024, we found that the more natural fields of planted barley (Gen 3:19, Ex 23:10, Ex 23:16, John4:36-38), in the Plains of Jericho (what's today referred to as the Jordan Valley) (Dt 8:7, Joshua 4:19), had become Aviv, and was either waiting to be cut, or had recently been swathed (cut and left on the ground to dry).

Based on when the barley became Aviv in the more natural planted fields (and the current state of the harvest), we believe the 7th month is to begin with the upcoming New Moon observation on 4 October 2024. We don't presume that our understanding is necessarily correct, it's simply the conclusion we've reached based on what we think we're seeing in the fields, and our current understanding of the relevant scriptures.
