Dear Friends,

We want to thank you for partnering with us to restore the Biblical Calendar, and to let you know that the crescent New Moon was sighted from Israel this evening, thus marking the beginning of the Biblical month!

The crescent New Moon was spotted with the naked eye on **Saturday, 1 March 2025**, from:

* Jerusalem at 5:55pm by Devorah Gordon, followed by Gil Ashendorf

As days in the Biblical Calendar are from sunset to sunset (Gen 1:3,8,13,19,23,31), Rosh Chodesh (the first day of the month), begins when the crescent New Moon has been sighted, and continues until sunset the following day. Rosh Chodesh a celebratory day (Num 10:10; Hosea 2:11), which was traditionally commemorated by blowing the shofar (Num 10:10; Psalm 81:4[3]), having a festive meal (1 Samuel 20:5, 24), and worshipping at the Beit HaMikdash (Temple) (Isaiah 66:23; Ezekiel 46:1-3) with a special sacrifice (Num 28:11-15; 2Chronicles 2:3; Ezra 3:4-5, Ezekiel 45:17, Ezekiel 46:6).

The photo at the top of this report was taken from our observation point in Jerusalem this evening. However, a photo isn't proof that it's the beginning of the Biblical Month, as the crescent can be seen any time after conjunction if the optical aid is able to magnify and/or create enough contrast. Remember, only a reliable witness can testify as to whether the crescent moon was spotted with the naked eye, as the ancient Israelites would have done.

On behalf of all of us who keep the Biblical Calendar, we wish to thank everyone in Israel who looked for the crescent moon and shared their observations with us in a timely manner, and all of you who are supporting this important effort from afar.

We're commanded to begin the Biblical Year with Chodesh HaAviv (month of the Aviv) (Ex 12:2, Ex 13:3-4, Ex 23:15, Ex 34:18, Dt 16:1). And we know that the barley fields become Aviv around the time of the Spring Equinox, as a result of the sun becoming stronger (Gen 1:14). Therefore, it's generally understood that Chodesh HaAviv (month of the Aviv), begins with the crescent New Moon sighting after the Spring Equinox, i.e after the barley has become Aviv. Remember, Chodesh HaAviv (month of Aviv) is when the fields are ready to feed the nation (Ex 9:31, Lev 23:14, Josh 5:10-12), everyone is able to bring an omer of their harvest to the Priest when they go up to the Temple for Chag HaMatzot (Feast of Unleavened Bread) (Lev 23:10, Ex 23:14-19, Ex 34:23-26, Dt 16:13-17), and Chag HaSukkot (Feast of Booths) will fall out at the end of the agricultural year (Ex 23:16, Ex 34:22, Lev 23:39, Dt 16:13).
