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This month shall be the beginning of months for you; it is to be the first month of the year to you. (Exodus 12:2)



Dear Friends,

We want to thankyou for partnering with us to restore the Biblical Calendar, and to take this opportunity to respond to some of your questions regarding leap years.

A leap year is when a calendar waits to begin the year, in order to catch up to the point on the solar cycle that it's anchored to.

Let's take a look at how this applies to the Biblical Calendar.

An ordinary Biblical Year is approximately 354 days (29.5 days x12 months = 354 days). However, a tropical year (the amount of time it takes earth to orbit the sun), is approximately 365.2422 days. This means that the Biblical Calendar lags from the solar cycle 11 days (365-354=11) a year. And this lag accumulates each year that no intervention is taken.

This means that if we were to simply begin each Biblical Year after 12 lunar months, the beginning of the year would quickly drift into earlier seasons. This isn't an option for the Biblical Calendar, as the months need to stay in sync with the solar / agricultural cycle, if we

are to bring the offerings of our harvests when we go up to the Temple for the feasts (Ex 23:14-19, Ex 34:23-26, Dt 16:13-17).

This is why we're explicitly told that the Biblical Calendar is a luni-solar calendar. Meaning that the beginning of the months, are determined by a particular phase of the lunar cycle, and the beginning of the years, are determined by a particular phase of the solar cycle (Gen 1:14).

Because we're instructed to always begin the Biblical Year with Chodesh HaAviv (month of the Aviv) (Ex 12:2, Ex 13:3-4, Ex 23:15, Ex 34:18, Dt 16:1), this means that the phase of the solar cycle that the Biblical Calendar is anchored to, is the Spring Equilux.

Therefore, the beginning of Chodesh HaAviv (month of the Aviv) [or some believe the beginning of Chag HaMatzot (Feast of Unleavened Bread)], can't be prior to the solar phase of the Spring Equilux. Just as the Biblical Month can't begin prior to the lunar phase of Conjunction.

Based on the Biblical description of Chodesh HaAviv (month of the Aviv), it's our understanding that the upcoming Biblical Year (2025) will begin on 30 March 2025 (assuming the crescent moon is sighted). For reference, the prior Biblical Month will begin on 1 March 2025 (assuming the crescent moon is sighted), which as explained above is too early in the solar cycle for it to be Chodesh HaAviv (month of the Aviv).

Below are the 2025 Holiday Dates based on the above understanding. We're hoping to be able to carry out a <u>Barley Inspection just prior to the New Moon Observation of 30 March 2025</u>, and could really use your prayers and support to help make this happen.

We're commanded to begin the Biblical Year with Chodesh HaAviv (Ex 12:2, Ex 13:3-4, Ex 23:15, Ex 34:18, Dt 16:1), which is the month when the planted (Gen 3:19, Ex 23:10, Ex 23:16) swathed barley fields (not desiccated), in the Plains of Jericho (Joshua 5:10-12) (what's today referred to as the Jordan Valley), become Aviv (Ex 12:2, Ex 13:3-4, Ex 23:15, Ex 34:18, Dt 16:1) in time for everyone can bring an Omer of their harvest to the Priest, when they go up to the Temple for Chag HaMatzot (Feast of Unleavened Bread) (Lev 23:10, Ex 23:14-19, Ex 34:23-26, Dt 16:13-17). Based on the above criteria, we believe the upcoming Biblical Year will begin on 30 March 2025 (assuming the crescent moon is sighted that evening). For reference, the prior Biblical Month will begin on 1 March 2025 (assuming the crescent moon is sighted), which is too early in the solar cycle for the planted swathed barley fields to the Jordan Valley to be Aviv in time.
