Dear Friends,

We want to thank you for partnering with us to restore the Biblical Calendar, and to let you know that the crescent New Moon was sighted from Israel this evening, thus marking the beginning of the **2nd Biblical Month**!

The crescent New Moon was spotted with the naked eye on Monday, 28 April 2025, from:

- \* Jerusalem at 7:45pm by Devorah Gordon, followed by Gil Ashendorf (optical aid wasn't used)
- \* GivatShmuel at 7:39pm by Gadi Eidelheit (probably first spotted using optical aid)
- \* Beer Shevaat 7:45pm by David Braham (don't know whether first spotted using optical aid)

As days in the Biblical Calendar are from sunset to sunset (Gen 1:3,8,13,19,23,31), Rosh Chodesh (the first day of the month), begins when the crescent New Moon has been sighted, and continues until sunset the following day. Rosh Chodesh a celebratory day (Num 10:10; Hosea 2:11), which was traditionally commemorated by blowing the shofar (Num 10:10; Psalm 81:4[3]), having a festive meal (1 Samuel 20:5, 24), and worshiping at the Beit HaMikdash (Temple) (Isaiah 66:23; Ezekiel 46:1-3) with a special sacrifice (Num 28:11-15; 2Chronicles 2:3; Ezra 3:4-5, Ezekiel 45:17, Ezekiel 46:6).

The photo at the top of this report was taken from our observation point in Jerusalem this evening. However, we want to remind you that a photo isn't proof that it's the beginning of the month, as the crescent can be sighted through a powerful enough optical aid (camera, binoculars, telescope), any time after conjunction. Only a reliable witness can testify as to whether there was enough contrast that evening, to spot the crescent moon with the naked eye, as the ancient Israelites would have done (Ps 104:19).

On behalf of all of us who keep the Biblical Calendar, we want to thank everyone in Israel who looked for the crescent moon, and all of you who are supporting this important effort from afar.
